Tips of the Month

Handy tips for newbies or experienced handlers. Please submit your favorite tips to share with club members.

As you start going to trials you'll notice what other handlers bring for their comfort and their dogs' comfort. Some items in the cooler months include crate covers to keep in the dog's body heat, propane "buddy heaters" to warm the crate or the handler's feet

and ground cloth/mat to provide a little insulation as well as defining your little area. Note: the Premium will usually tell you if indoor-safe propane heaters are allowed.

What does that mean?

Definitions of terms from training, trialing or dogs in general. Don't be afraid to ask for more!

YPS – Yard Per Second a measure of the dog's rate of speed as it covers the course.

BCs – Border Collies. Many dog breeds are referred to by their intials. **GSD** (German Shepherd Dog) is another very common one.

Fun Match – an unoffical trial done for practice & fun. It does not count toward any titles, but provides a training setting that is good preparation for trials.

Huckleberry Hounds Dog Cookies

We use a STANDARD RECIPE as follows:

2 ½ cups whole wheat flour

3/4 cup nonfat dry milk

1 egg

½ cup vegetable oil
2 cubes beef buillion

3/4 cup boiling water (for bouillon)
2 Tablespoons brown sugar

Preheat oven to 300°. Dissolve bouillon in water, let cool. Combine all ingredients & knead dough for 1 minute. On floured surface, roll out to 1/4" thickness. Cut into small shapes about 1" wide. Bake 30 minutes and let cool completely. Air dry thoroughly before bagging. Use ziplock sandwich bags and fill with 5-6 ounces of cookies, no more. Place in freezer until needed.

Please do not make any substitutions or additions, as this ensures quality control.

CS made a motion to approve the 2020 budget, 2nd by CJ, motion passed unanimously

<u>New Officers:</u> The names of individuals running for the board positions of President, VP, Secy Treasurer, and 2 members at large (1 to replace immediate past president) will be published in the November newsletter. Voting will take place on December 15, 2020 at the club Christmas party.

<u>Bazaar:</u> Thompson Falls will have the usual Christmas bazaar on December 7 from 10-4. The club will have a booth as before. We will sell our current inventory which includes west paw toys, ornaments, glasses, jar toppers as well as the cookies donated by members. An e-mail will be sent for workers for the bazaar. West paw toys have always been our best income. CS has an inventory. A motion was made by KH and 2nd by DM for CS to purchase more toys for approx \$358. A 2nd motion was made to increase the price 50% of wholesale cost which is still lower than can be bought at a store.

Both motions passed unanimously.

DM will make some small snuffle mats and bandanas. VW moved, CS 2nd to pay DM for supplies.

CB. VW and KH will meet on the 6th to get all the supplies from the Grange.

Club Christmas Party: December 15, Elks, 6-9 pm. Potluck and magician!!

New Business:

<u>Club clothes:</u> CS put all the club clothes at the Grange along with a bucket to place payment. Prices are listed on the boxes, give payment to member in charge when making purchase. That member will get the money to CS.

<u>Therapy Dogs:</u> KH is applying with TDI (therapy dogs international) to become a certified evaluator. A test will be scheduled for interested club members in the future pending certification. Club members present offered to assist in setting up the test.

Club Activities:

AKC Fit Club: No dates have been set for any walks at this time. The requirement for the <u>club</u> is to hold 4 walks/year. CS passed out a form for <u>individuals</u> to use if they are interested in applying for a magnet "certifying" that the handler/dog team has met the following requirements: 30 minutes 5 times per week for 3 months or 15 min 10 times per week for 3 months.
